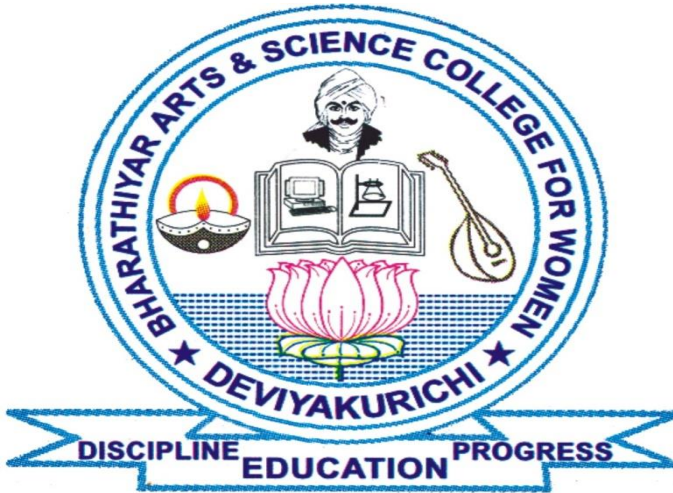

Student Segmentation: Students are segmented based on learning ability, personality, communication skills, talents, career focus and social consciousness. The programmes of the college are then customized to cater to the needs of each student segment.

Bridge Course: All the first year students undergo a Bridge course enabling them to have a smooth transition from school to college, help them imbibe the learning philosophy of the institution and kindle in her the curiosity for life-long learning.

Creating an exciting Learning Environment: Innovative Teaching Methodologies such as Quiz, Case study, Guest lectures, Role play, Group discussion, Brainstorming, Audio Visual Presentations, Simulations and projects are followed.

Industry Institution Interface: The College in its constant endeavour to keep abreast with the latest trends has an active interface with industry through guest lectures, seminars and workshops. Students are given an opportunity to explore and develop their hobbies and interests through varied training programmes.

Department Clubs: Every Department has a student club which serves as a healthy platform for intellectual interaction through various inter collegiate and intramural co-curricular competitions.

Internship: An intensive 2 weeks industrial training enables every student to gain hands on experience.

Community Service: The College has adopted several schools and communities to be beneficiaries of the extension work. Every year, NSS Volunteers of the College represent Tamil Nadu at the Republic Day Camp Parade. NSS Volunteers also participate in several International Youth Exchange Programmes. All extension work relates to education and empowerment of the less privileged community. e.g. Health awareness, Various Camps and Remedial Education.

Counseling: The College has empanelled professional counselors to support the psychological and emotional wellbeing of the young girl students of the college.

Placement: The College has an active Placement Cell that assists students seeking jobs. During the previous year, around **450 students** received appointment orders from 17 reputed companies.

Extra Curricular Activities: The College provides adequate opportunities to display the innate talents of the students in dance, debate, dramatics etc. through inter and intra collegiate cultural festivals.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

The Choice Based Credit System is a flexible system of learning. The CBCS was introduced for various programmes offered by the University from 2008-09 onwards. The distinguishing student friendly features of CBCS allow students to:

- Learn at their own pace
- Choose electives from a wide range of elective courses offered by the University departments with consultation of Department Faculty Members
- Adopt inter-disciplinary approach by choosing supportive papers in learning and make best use of the expertise of available faculty.

DEPARTMENTS AND PROGRAMMES

There are 27 departments offering programmes at various levels under the CBCS. A programme consists of number of courses. A 'Course' is a component (a paper) of a programme. Every course offered by the University departments is identified by a unique course code. A course may be designed to involve lectures / tutorials / laboratory work/ seminar / project work / practical training / assignments / industrial training / viva voce, etc. or a combination of these, to meet effectively the

teaching and learning needs and the credits may be assigned suitably.

SEMESTERS

An academic year consists of two semesters namely, Odd Semester (I and III Semesters): July to November; and Even Semester (II and IV Semesters): December to April. A semester normally extends over a period of 15 weeks. Each week has 30 hours instruction spread over a 5 day week. The duration of each semester shall be 90 working days for all PG Programme and 120 working days for B.Voc., Programme inclusive of examinations.

CREDITS

Credit defines the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. Thus, normally in each of the courses, credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of lectures/tutorial/ laboratory work and other forms of learning required to complete the course contents in a 15-week schedule:

1 Credit=Minimum 1 hour of lecture per week (1Credit course= Minimum 15 hours oflectures per semester)

3 Credits = Minimum 3 hours of lecture per week
(3 Credit course = Minimum 45 hours oflectures per semester)

The total minimum credits required for awarding a two year PG degree is 90, and for B.Voc., it is 180.

PROJECT

Each student shall be required to take up an Individual Student Project Work at PG level and submit it at the end of the final semester. Students shall be allotted to all the faculty members for project guidance in a departmental committee meeting with the concurrence of all the members. A copy of the Project Report shall be submitted to the Department on or before the last date fixed by the Department/University. The Project shall be evaluated by the guide and an external examiner nominated by the University and viva-voce examination be conducted to award the marks as per norms.

Learning Outcomes Based Education (OBE) Curriculum:

The learning outcomes-based curriculum framework for education is a framework based on the expected learning outcomes and academic standards that are expected to be attained by graduates of a programme of study and holder of a qualification.

The OBE was introduced for various programmes offered by the University from 2019-20 onwards. The overall objectives of the learning outcomes-based curriculum framework are to:

- Formulate graduate attributes, qualification descriptors, Programme Learning Outcomes and Course Learning Outcomes that are expected to be demonstrated by the holder of a qualification;
- Enable prospective students, parents, employers and others to understand the nature and level of learning outcomes (knowledge, skills, attitudes and values) or attributes a graduate of a programme should be capable of demonstrating on successful completion of the programme of study;
- Maintain national standards and international comparability of learning outcomes and academic standards to ensure global competitiveness, and to facilitate student/graduate mobility; and
- Provide higher education institutions an important point of reference for designing teaching-learning strategies, assessing student learning levels, and periodic review of programmes and academic standards.

EXAMINATIONS

There shall be examinations at the end of each semester: for odd semesters in October/ November; and for even semesters in April/May.

EVALUATION

The performance of a student in each course is evaluated in terms of percentage of marks with a provision for conversion to grade points. Evaluation for each course shall be done by a Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) by the course teacher concerned as well as by an end semester examination and will be consolidated at the end of the semester.

Condonation

Students must have 75% of attendance in each semester to appear for the examination. Students who have attendance between 65% and 74% shall apply for condonation in the prescribed form with the prescribed fee to write the examination in the same semester. Students who have attendance between 50% and 64% shall apply for condonation in prescribed form with the prescribed fee along with the Medical Certificate in the current semester but they can write their examinations only in the next semester. Students who have attendance below 50% are not eligible to appear for the examination. But the student can continue the programme to complete the duration. To complete the programme they shall re- do the semester(s) after completion of the programme duration to acquire required attendance for appearing missed semester examinations.

However, the candidates have to clear all the subjects prescribed for programme within $N+3$ Years to acquire degree, where N denotes the duration of the programme.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE STUDENTS

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT

- ◆ Students must have 75% attendance to be permitted to take up end semester examination.
- ◆ Condonation may be permitted if a student has 60% attendance. In case of **Medical Emergencies** (supported by sufficient evidence).

LEAVE RULES

All leave must be supported by leave letter.

- ◆ In cases of planned leave, leave letter must be submitted prior to availing leave.
- ◆ In case of all other leave (medical and other emergencies), leave letter must be submitted on the date the student reports to the college.
- ◆ All medical leave beyond 3 working days must be supported by a certificate from a registered medical practitioner.

The Decision of the Principal will be final in all matters relating to attendance and leave.

DISCONTINUATION OF COURSE

In cases where a student discontinues her course of study, she shall pay the fees due, for the balance period of the course, to be eligible to receive the Transfer Certificate and the Conduct Certificate.

UNAUTHORISED COLLECTION OF MONEY

The College does not collect any money other than the Tuition and Examination fees.

REQUEST FOR TESTIMONIALS

Requests for certificates, testimonials or any other attestation should be made in writing addressed to the Principal through the Head of Department. The request shall be effected within the working days of submission of the request.

LIBRARY RULES

- ◆ The Library will be open from 9.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. during all working days.
- ◆ Students are permitted to borrow books at a time by producing the Library card.
- ◆ Books marked 'Reference only' will not be issued.
- ◆ All books should be handled with care and must not be tampered with in any manner.

- ◆ A book may be renewed if available.
- ◆ Students may approach the Librarian / H.O.D / Principal in case of any difficulty using the facilities of the Library.
- ◆ Photocopying facility is available inside the library during specified hours.

DRESS CODE

Obscenity and vulgarity in dressing is strictly prohibited. Simple, modest and comfortable dress in keeping with the dignity and decorum of the college should be worn. T shirts, three fourth pants, sleeveless tops, shorts and miniskirts are not permitted.

IDENTITY CARD

An identity card is issued to every student. The student has to wear the ID card at all times inside the campus. In case of loss of ID card, duplicate ID card may be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.

TRAFFIC AND PARKING RULES

For Two - wheeler users

- ◆ Two wheeler parking is available inside the campus.
- ◆ Both the rider and the pillion rider must wear a helmet.
- ◆ Severe disciplinary action will be taken against a student who does not wear helmet or possess a valid license.

Four - wheelers are strictly not permitted. Four wheelers cannot be parked even outside the college campus.

FOOD

- ◆ The college has a cafeteria that supplies healthy and wholesome food at reasonable prices.
- ◆ Students may also bring their own food that can be eaten at the cafeteria.

LOSS OF PROPERTY

- ◆ **Students are requested not to wear heavy or expensive jewellery and accessories.**
- ◆ **Students are requested not to carry valuables and heavy cash.**
- ◆ **The Management, Principal and staff shall not be responsible for the loss of any belongings of the student.**

MOBILE PHONES

- ◆ **Students are not permitted to use mobile phones/iPods inside the college campus. Violation of this rule will lead to serious disciplinary action, including issue of Transfer Certificate.**

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Malpractices such as copying or attempt to copy in Tests or Exams can lead to the student being debarred from examinations for 3 years.

Principal has the right to suspend or issue a TC to any student who indulges in any such malpractice, who does not abide by the Code of Conduct of the college or fails to maintain dignity and decorum in her interactions with her fellow students, faculty, Administrative staff, Principal and Management of the College.
