**15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary**

Bharathiyar Arts and Science College for Women has always strived for a diverse approach in both academic and co-curricular activities. Students are encouraged to join teams from various courses to participate in minor/major projects that are multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary in character. Students are also eager to form teams of students from other areas to compete in activities. Our students are given the opportunity to choose their own pathways by using their wits and e-learning resources, rather than following those that have already been decided for them by the educational system.

**16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):**

We encourage our students to take online courses through national programmes such as SWAYAM, NPTEL, and others, and credits earned for elective courses are taken into account. Curriculum change for the academic year 2022-2023 has begun. Students will be affected by these changes beginning with the 2022-23 school year. We are developing technology that will allow us to perform ABC in its true essence. Students create ABC ID for their part.

We train farmers in advanced agricultural techniques through Bharathiyar Farm. Farmers and prospective applicants are interested in learning about the most recent farming techniques, such as Organic Farming and Terrace Gardening. Students are being assigned mini projects in which they identify their skills to produce various objects and understand the themes through experience learning. Students can improve their creative abilities by taking skill development classes such as Tailoring, Beautician, Aari work, and Type writing. We are also creating skill-based certificate courses for outside dropout students to teach them in specialised skills

The Indian Knowledge System will encompass knowledge from ancient India to the present, as well as a clear sense of India's future objectives in education, health, and the environment. Instead of being confined by geographical boundaries, students can take classes from any location of their choosing, and institutions can reach out to a broad network of students. Students can clear up their uncertainties by taking part in live conversations or forums from the comfort and security of their own homes. On the plus side, online learning has increased both staff and student technology literacy.

Both the instructor and student groups swiftly accepted computers and smartphones. However, while we all acknowledge India's physical and cultural richness, it also has a substantial economic disparity. Access to online education remains a challenge for many people due to factors such as power supply, internet connectivity, and the cost of necessary devices. A thorough and comprehensive institutional level approach is required to address these difficulties.

Bharathiyar Arts and Science College for Women offers a variety of courses and programmes to address cross-cutting issues such as gender, the environment and sustainability, human values, and professional ethics, including Value education, EVS, Environment projects, Extension activities for all programmes.

Academic commitment is realised in the form of a two-credit course on Environmental Studies offered as part of the Under Graduate programmes. Institutional practices enforce eco-friendliness and environment conservation. The courses such as Energy Physics, Alternative branch of medicine 'Siddha', Tourism, Archaeology, General Knowledge - India, General Science, Environmental Biology and Toxicology of different programmes focus on environmental awareness and sustainability which deals with various range of renewable energy sources and natural resources of forest, irrigation and mining.

The courses are offered as Feminist Writing, Entrepreneurial Development, Women's writing, International current affairs and Teaching of social reformer to various Under Graduate students with the view to inform, intervene and inculcate the women's rights,

laws, principles and values.

The college offers courses on values and ethics viz. Human Rights and Value Education – Yoga with two-credit Non Major Electives as part of the Post Graduate and Under Graduate curriculum respectively. The various courses like Business Law, Income Tax Law and Practice, Auditing, Organizational Behavior, Tourism and Travel Management and Journalism will enable the students to follow the ethics of the profession or vocation concerned.

Teachers share study materials like Notes, Power Point Presentations(PPTs), Question Banks, e-books over different media like Google Classroom, E-Mail, College Portal, Blogs andWhatsapp . The Institution favors establishing an ICT based learning process in addition to the traditional blackboard way of teaching. In the classrooms, the Faculty members create and present PPTs that allow them to have an interactive conversation with the students. Most of the classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors withscreens. The College provides a free Wi-Fi connection.

The Library is routinely updated with Online resources, Inflibnet, and related e-resources to keep students and Faculty members up to date on current events. An electronic Barcode system is used to keep track of library entries.

## 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The Institution is affiliated with Periyar University, The examination process at the College is focused on the Exam Cell. The timetable for the assessment test will be prepared by the exam cell and displayed on the college notice board and circulated to the students.

- The criterion is objective and transparent, devoid of any bias on the part of the Faculty members .
- Student performance is regularly assessed through assignments and tests and students are given ample opportunities to improve.
- Students are free to interact with the Faculty members to resolve grievances, if any regarding the assessment.
- Seminars are conducted on a regular basis.

As per the University guidelines, the results of Internal theory examinations, submission of assignments and participation in Seminars, Quizzes, and attendance percentage are incorporated into the final internal marks, which are submitted to the University through the Web portal.

25% of the total marks are allotted for Internal marks. For a 100-mark paper, 25 marks of internal marks are given as follows: 10 marks for Internal Test, 10 marks for Assignment (Project, Presentations), and 5 marks for attendance. Final examinations are conducted by the University and evaluated centrally.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The affiliated University is incharge of External examinations, while the College is incharge of Internal assessments. Assignments, Tests and Attendance are all part of the Internal Examination.

- Three internal assessment tests are conducted each Semester at department level.
- Time table for test is prepared well in advance and communicated to the students earlier.
- A proper seating plan is followed. After evaluation of internal assessment answer scripts, the scripts are shown to the students to check any discrepancy or doubt in checking.
- Internal audits are carried out with the utmost care, transparency and impartiality.

Bharathiyar Arts and Science for Women is located on a serene 10.51-acre campus. A total built-up area 21241.87 Sq.mt and 6705.15 Sq.mt is used for the dormitory.

#### Classrooms:

The college has SIX Wi-Fi- enabled academic blocks comprising 98 classrooms with spacious with 77, ICT enabled and LCD Projectors with interactive Board for the enhancement of Teaching-Learning pedagogy.

#### Laboratories:

The college features 22 laboratories to provide students with practical experience.

#### Library:

The library, which serves as a learning resource centre, has 29,754 text books, 100 international and national journals and magazines with back volumes, project dissertation reports, and access to e-resources via DELNET and INFLIBNET via the Digital Library, which has 20 computers.

A total of eight CCTV cameras are installed on campus. Aside from the 10 solar lights, the campus has a 125 KV watt kirloshkar module that provides power.

The institution is Divyangjan-friendly, including a ground-floor classroom, a ramp, and restroom facilities, allowing divyangjans to

feel at ease when using the infrastructure.

63 buses are available to serve both staff and students.

With over 100 students, the college offers a highly safe and hygienic hostel. A single room with individual cots and cupboards is shared by four students.

Our college, which makes extensive use of e-resources, is currently ranked 1th and 2nd in India last 7 month.

Our institution features a contemporary central library with a collection of 29,754books published by reputable authors on a variety of topics. In addition, our library has over 600 student projects, 70journals and magazines, and 310 education-related CDs and videos. Delnet and N-List are both institutional memberships at our college library. Students can improve their academic and research performance by using e-resources software such as INFLIBNETand NDL.

Teachers share study materials like Notes, Power Point Presentations(PPTs), Question Banks, e-books over different media like Google Classroom, E-Mail, College Portal, Blogs and Whatsapp . The Institution favors establishing an ICT based learning process in addition to the traditional blackboard way of

teaching. In the classrooms, the Faculty members create and present PPTs that allow them to have an interactive conversation with the students. Most of the classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors with screens. The College provides a free Wi-Fi connection.

The Library is routinely updated with Online resources, Inlibnet, and related e-resources to keep students and Faculty members up to date on current events. An electronic Barcode system is used to keep track of library entries.

There is the use of Multimedia teaching aids like LCD projectors in classrooms with internet-enabled Computers and Laptop . The Institution has a Seminar Hall and a large auditorium equipped with Multimedia tools. Guest Lectures are conducted regularly in Seminar halls using ICT tools.

- Student performance is regularly assessed through assignments and tests and students are given ample opportunities to improve.

In 1997, the college library's extension centre was founded in 2014 in the college's UG library, PG library, and Digital library.

The library's LAN network is synchronized with an Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), which consists of five client computers and one server.

Our college, which makes extensive use of e-resources, is currently ranked 1th and 2nd in India last 7 month.

The library's administration system was completely automated. We also have a digital library that subscribes to e-resources

IQAC encouraged faculty members to employ ICT technologies in their teaching and learning. It was suggested that the college buy ICT equipment, such as the most up-to-date configurations for PCs, laptops, LED TVs, and projectors.

Academic Audits conducted by IQAC regularly to ensure the effective implementation of Teaching - Learning process. The Expert members from the academic audit visit all the departments once in a year to inspect the records related to academics. The experts committee reviews the Profile of the Department, Infrastructure and the Academic Activities of the preceding year of every department. The assessment of the strengths and weaknesses of the departments are reviewed by the members of the academic audit. The review of the result analysis, best practices and future plans is audited periodically. The audit recommended measures for improvement identification and eradication of weakness in teaching, learning and evaluation, student support and progression. The Academic Audit ensures the effective and efficient functioning of the departments, capacity building, research, publications and curricular aspects.
